

CHRISTMAS TREE FOUNDATION PAPER PIECING SCRAPPY QUILT PATTERN

This pattern was designed to be user friendly and is divided into blocks identified by letters and numbers. Each block is sized (7.5"x7.5) to easily print on standard size printing paper. This pattern has two options, a square throw that is a tree without the star on top, or a rectangle throw that includes the star. When complete, this quilt measures either 60"x60" or 60"x77.5"but can be resized as desired.

This is a beginner level pattern. However, a basic understanding of foundation paper piecing prior to starting this design is required. If you have never tried Foundation Paper Piceing I recommend taking this class.

Understanding the Blocks

Within each block, pieces are labeled in the order in which they are sewn (1, 2, 3 etc.) and with the fabric color (using codes described on page 3).

The Fabric


This quilt is designed as a way for you to use up your scraps. You could also use a few jelly rolls. This pattern does contain a list of all colors included in the quilt. However, you do not need to use the same fabric for the color each time. For example, for a dark green you might alternate fabrics that are dark green. Feel free to get creative. As long as a piece is close to the color on the swatch your quilt will turn out great.

Fabric Choices

Examples of labels that will be used on blocks:

1/T1 -1 means sew this piece first. T1 means that it is the first and darkest green in the tree.

2/RL4 -2 means sew this piece second. RL4 means the fourth and lightest red for the red Christmas lights



Fabric Amounts

This quilt is designed for using up scraps. However, if you would like to purchase fabric you will need around 1 yard for T1, T2, T3, S1 and S3. You will need about 1/2 yard S2, S4 and W. All the rest of the colors require less than a Fat Quarter.

*With the optional row: Add a quarter of a yeard of S1, S2, S3 and W.


*There are some blocks that repeat. If a block has two block names listed on it, you should print it out twice. If it had four please print out four copies etc.









